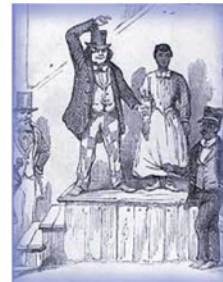

Slavery in Canada?

Lt.-Gov. Simcoe's Act of 1793 A Law to End Slavery in Upper Canada

Turn back the clock 200 years
Create a courtroom in your classroom
Struggle along with 18th century characters in real life dramas
Decide who goes free and who remains enslaved



A Grade 7 History - British North America curriculum program in which your students will:

- Understand the terms of the Act of 1793, (a law to bring about the gradual end to slavery in Upper Canada);
- Summarize the main points of the Act in simple language;
- Describe and analyze conflicting points of view about the Act;
- Learn that government leaders cannot always do what they know to be right; the need for compromise;
- Express their understanding of the Act's effect on people's lives:
 - Through dramatization of real situations that might appear before a 1793 judge
 - Through writing pro- or anti-slavery letters to Lieutenant-Governor Simcoe or an entry in a personal journal
